### AGENDA ITEMS

#### I: Welcome

The monthly District Education Improvement Committee, (DEIC) meeting for October was held at the ESC building training room A. Dr. Beck, Assistant Superintendent of Curriculum and Instruction, called the meeting to order.

Mr. Greg Ollis, superintendent, gave a warm welcome and thanked all committee members. Mr. Ollis spoke to the committee about the importance of being a part of the DEIC and attending all meetings.

#### II: DEIC Roles and Responsibilities

Dr. Beck spoke to the committee about picking up on the District Improvement Plan (DIP) from where the 2013-2014 committee left off. He explained that the majority of the plan was up-to-date but there were some areas they need to work on to complete the plan. Areas that need work are; more outreach for community involvement, getting parent and students engaged with their campus. He reviewed what was presented to the board last year.

Dr. Beck pointed out several of the people present at this meeting because they worked on their section of the district improvement plan. The committee worked on selected sections of the DIP with the person that worked on that section so that the plan could be finished. The committee voted to have the DIP to the board by the end of the month so they had time to review it before the next scheduled board meeting.

#### III: STAAR Data/New News from Austin/PBMAS

Dr. Beck reviewed the drafts for the 2014 Accountability Data with the committee. They discussed changes needed on all five drafts, I. Accountability, II. Student Progress, III. Closing the Gap, IV. College Readiness, V. All of CISD Met Standard. Dr. Beck and Mr. Niemeyer gave examples of the focus area improvements and a group discussion followed.

Dr. Beck announced that Hamblen Elementary received 5 Distinctions out of 6.

Mrs. Patricia Glaeser, Testing Coordinator, spoke about the System Safeguards or Federal Accountability System. She explained that the safeguards are set at 79% students passing and it will go up for the 2015-16 school year to 83%. She also said that any safeguards missed will need to be addressed in the DIP and that none of the CISD schools were on the Priority state list.

Mrs. Glaeser also explained about the School and Community Engagement Tool and that every district has to rate themselves and have it posted on-line.
